

## Wind Twirler

Materials:

Craft Foam or Card Stock or paper plate

Stickers

Markers or crayons

Yarn

Scissors and a Hole Punch

Instructions:

1. Cut a large circle in the craft foam or card stock. Cut a spiral shape to the middle of circle.
2. Encourage children to decorate the spiral. They can also write things on it such as what they are thankful for or what special gifts God has given them.
3. Using the hole punch make a hole in the inner end of the spiral. Hang it up with a piece of yarn. Like the air the Holy Spirit is with us even though we cannot see it.

## Kite

Materials:

A full sheet of newspaper or garbage bag

Two 1/4 inch round wooden dowels (one 18 to 24 inches, one 4 inches shorter)

Scissors

Pencil

String

Masking tape or packing tape

Ruler or yardstick

Yarn and/or ribbons

Instructions:

1. Make notches in each end of the dowels.
2. Secure dowel together using string. The shorter dowel should be placed 6 inches from the top of the longer one to create a t shape).
3. Ensure the notches are parallel to the floor and create a string frame (around the outside of the kite) through each of the notches.
4. Lay the newsprint or garbage bag on the floor /table with the kite frame over top of it. Cut out leaving a 1 inch seam allowance. Secure the newsprint or garbage bag to the frame by folding seam allowance over the frame and using masking or packing tape.
5. Cut a piece of string the same size as your longest dowel. Punch a hole in the top and bottom to secure this string then add tape to the top and bottom to ensure your bridle is secure. This is what you will attach your kite string to to fly your kite.
6. Cut a 24 inch piece of string to act as the tail, tie ribbon every 5 or 6 inches starting at the 6 inch mark. Using tape attach to the bottom of the kite.
7. Attach your role of kite string to the bridle and go have fun.
