African Heritage Month: The 2021 African Heritage Month theme, Black History Matters: Listen, Learn, Share and Act, recognizes the important legacy of people of African descent and the long-standing history in the development of Canada. The theme brings focus and increased awareness of racialized issues of a community that has

overcome great adversity for inclusion. It further calls on us to listen, learn, share and act to make society a better place.

Nova Scotia has over 50 historic African Nova Scotian communities with a long, deep, and complex history dating back over 400 years. African Heritage Month provides us with another opportunity to celebrate our culture, legacy, achievements, and contributions of people of African Descent – past and present.

Truth & Reconciliation – Call #69 Museums and Archives – We call upon Library and Archives Canada to: i) fully adopt and implement the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and the UN Joinet-Orentlicher Principles, as related to Aboriginal peoples' inalienable right to know the truth about what happened and why, with regard to human rights violations committed against them in the residential schools, ii) ensure that its record holdings related to residential schools are accessible to the public, and iii) commit more resources to its public education materials and programming on residential schools. [UN Joinet-Orentlicher Principles = People who have been subjected to human rights violations have a right to know the truth, as part of their right to an effective remedy.]
